

FURTHER STUDY: FAITHFULNESS

Memory verse:

Psalm 33:4 *“For the word of the Lord is right and true; he is faithful in all he does.”*

God is faithful to us in many ways. Let's dive into the Word to uncover more about his faithful character! Take a look at the passages below for just a few examples of God's faithfulness.

God = Faithful to Provide:

Psalm 34:10; James 1:16-18; Philippians 3:19; Matthew 6:25-33

What do these Scripture passages have in common? How does God provide for our physical and spiritual needs? In your journal, write down all the ways that God has provided for you, your family, and your community.

God = Faithful to Protect:

Psalm 28:7; Psalm 84:11; Romans 8:34; 1 Corinthians 10:13; 2 Thessalonians 3:3

What can we learn from each of these passages about the different ways God protects us? Consider the significance of each verse. In your journal, write down all the ways God has been faithful to protect you from harm and from the schemes of the enemy.

God = Faithful to His Word:

John 8:36; Romans 8:1-2; Ephesians 1:3-14; Colossians 1:11-13

How was God faithful to fulfill his promise to us by delivering us from the curse of sin? How have we been brought out of darkness and into light? How does God being true to his word impact our trust in him? In your journal, write down all the ways God has been faithful to his promises.

As Christians we are called to reflect the same character of God. The more we understand of God's loyalty, dependability, and trustworthiness, the more we will be able to implement those aspects of faithfulness in our own walk with the Lord.

Jesus also encourages his disciples to exemplify faithfulness to the Kingdom of God in the same way he did. Take time to consider what you can learn from Jesus' example and how you can reflect his devotion and obedience to the Word and will of the Father.

Followers = Faithful to the Kingdom:

Matthew 25:14-30
